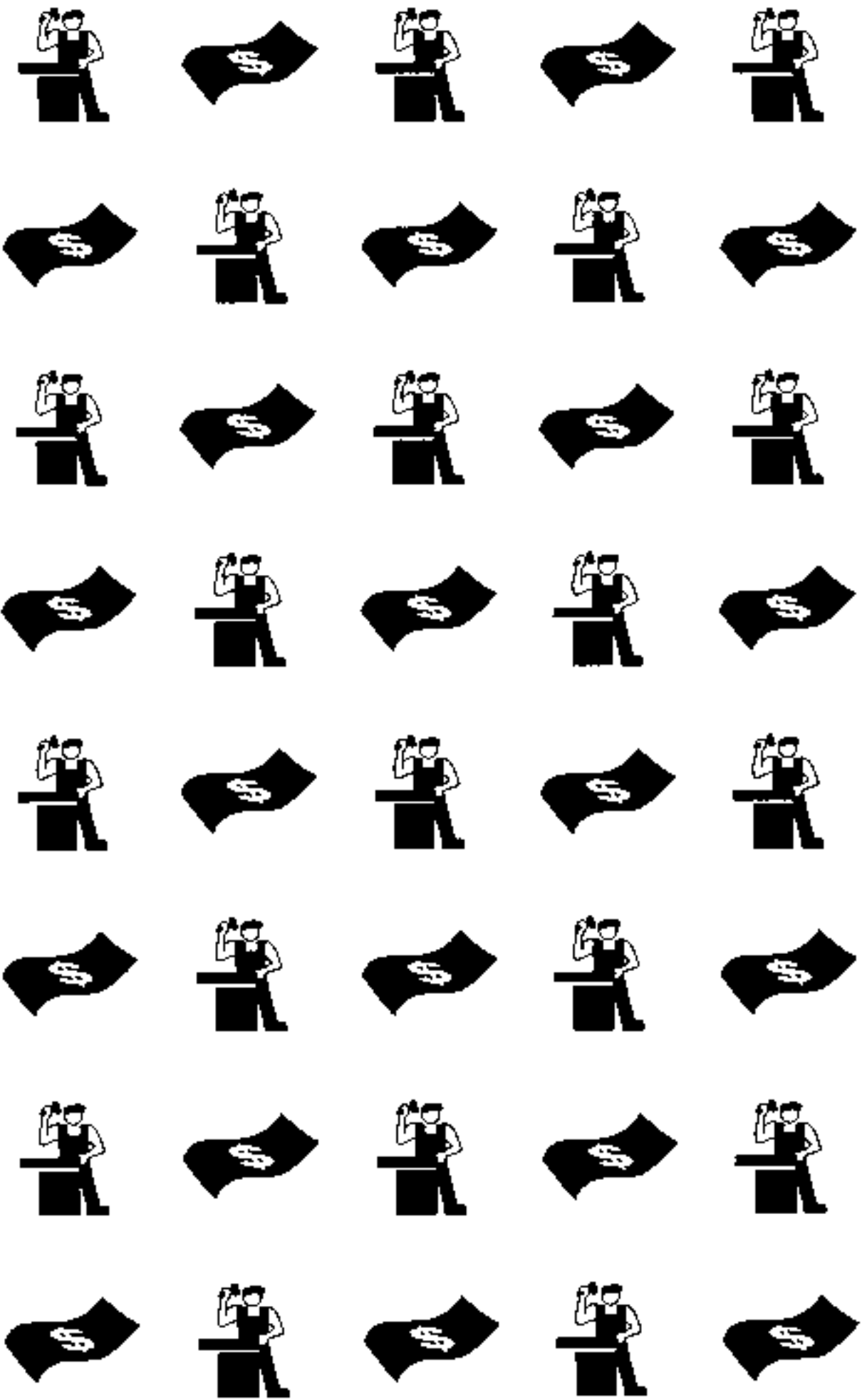

FINANCE & LABOR

Part one of this section presents statistics on the financial institutions on Maui. Part two includes figures for Maui County's labor force.

The civilian labor force for 2015 was 84,250 and the number of employed was 81,050. The unemployment rate decreased from 4.5% to 3.8% between 2014 and 2015.

Data for this section came from many sources, including the Hawai'i State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism and the Hawai'i Department of Industrial Labor and Relations.
